



The purpose of the Pupil Deprivation grant is to improve the educational attainment of pupils from low income families and who are entitled to free school meals (eFSM).

Schools are expected to maximise the use of the funding by introducing sustainable strategies which will quickly lead to improved outcomes for pupils entitled to free school meals.

In 2023/24, Brynteg C P School was allocated a total Pupil Deprivation Grant of £93,150.
